5-28 August

Getting to the hospital

Kingston Hospital strongly recommends patients and visitors use public transport to get to the hospital.

Travelling by train

Between the 5 and 28 August inclusive, the nearest railway stations are:

Kingston train station

Just under one mile from Kingston Hospital

All train services will go via Twickenham and Richmond which will extend journey times by around 20 minutes.

A typical journey from London Waterloo will take approximately 45 minutes.

First train arrives: **06.16** (from London Waterloo). Last train leaves: **23.34**

Bus No's 57, 85 & 213 are 24 hour services and operate on average every 8-10 minutes and every 5 minutes in morning and evening peak.

Nearest stop to Kingston station is at Cromwell Road Bus station.

New Malden train station

Approximately two miles from Kingston Hospital. A typical journey from London Waterloo will take around 20 minutes.

First train arrives: **05.23** (from London Waterloo). Last train leaves: **23.59** (direct to Waterloo) **00.17** (to Wimbledon)

Bus 213 is a 24 hour service and operates on average every 8-10 minutes and every 5 minutes in morning and evening peak.

Nearest stop to New Malden station is outside Tesco Metro on Coombe Road.

A guide to using public transport from nearby railway stations:

Travelling from:	Suggested Route:
London Waterloo	Train to Kingston then Bus No 57, 85 or 213 and K2, K3, K4, K5 or Train to New Malden then Bus No 213
Clapham Junction	Train to Kingston then Bus No 57, 85 or 213 and K2, K3, K4, K5 or Train to New Malden then Bus No 213
Wimbledon	Train to New Malden then bus 213 or 57 bus directly from Wimbledon/Raynes Park
Raynes Park	Train to New Malden then bus 213 or 57 bus directly from Wimbledon/Raynes Park
Earlsfield (Closed until 10am and between 4.30 and 7.30pm – weekdays only)	When station is open: Train to New Malden then Bus No 213 When station is closed: Travel via nearest alternative station or use buses No 44, 77 or 270 to Tooting Broadway and then No 57 to Kingston Hospital
Queenstown Road (Closed 5-28 August)	Travel via Clapham Junction
Hampton Court	Train to Surbiton then Bus No K2 or K3
Surbiton	Travel via bus No K2 or K3 or K4

Travelling by bus

Kingston Hospital is served by a number of bus routes. Low-floor, wheelchair accessible buses run on all the routes serving the hospital.

Bus stops:

Kingston Hospital Forecourt - K2 and K4

Galsworthy Road - K3, 57, 213 and N213

Coombe Road - K2, K3, K4, K5

Kingston Hill - 57, 85, 213, N213

Travelling by car:

If you wish to travel by car, please be aware that parking at the hospital site is very limited and you should allow yourself plenty of time to find a parking space. At busy times, there may be queues for spaces.
